


August 2021

- 1. A meeting of the office bearers of the NGO was held at the residence of the Secretary, Mrs. Poonam Srivastava. The following activities were done
 - Proposal made by the treasurer, Ms. Kusum Kanta to open a current account of the NGO in the Madan Mahal branch of Union Bank was unanimously passes after consultation.
 - Proposal to provide nutritional food to malnourished children enrolled in Aganbari was passed.
 - Resolution to help children facing obstruction in studies due to the death of the earning member of the family due to COVID-19 was passed.
 - An action plan for the month of September was discussed.

4. NGO decided to provide books, copies, and stationary to two students studying in Class VII and Class X to facilitate their education. They lost their father untimely during the second wave of COVID-19 and are facing economic crisis since then.



5. On 15th August, 2021, Independence Day celebrations were organized at the office of Women and Child Development Project in Rampur. NGO's President, Mrs. Savita Verma performed the flag hoisting ceremony. Those present during Independence Day celebration were employees of the WCD office and grief stricken members of families affected by COVID-19.







- 6. NGO received information about the economic crisis faced by Anita Ben, Anjali Bhumiya and, Hiralal Sen, an elderly woman, due to losing their husbands to COVID-19 during its second wave and provided them ration to suffice for a month.
- 7. Shubh Dwivedi, a class IV student of MGM School who was orphaned during the second wave of the pandemic had to quit school due to unpaid fees. After meeting his mother, Archana Dwivedi it was decided that NGO's Vice President, Adv. Arvind Srivastava and Founder Member, Mrs. Madhuka Srivastava will meet the school's management to request for concession in Shubh's remaining fees. During their meeting with the school principal, Rev. Fr. Joseph K. K, Arvind and Madhuka presented the planned proposal and also committed and assured that the fees of the upcoming academic session will be provided by the NGO.





On behalf of the NGO, Mrs. Madhuka Srivastava visited MGM School to meet the management and pay school fees on behalf of Shubh Dwivedi. She ensured that the admission process is duly completed.
